

Visual Arts

Students who enter the visual art world will explore a variety of artists, art processes and materials, including sketching, painting, printmaking, two-& three-dimensional design, and digital art.



Healthcare

Students participate in reallife scenarios to practice learned skills. They get to experience a day on the job when they go back for a full day of simulation with the nursing students as part of their clinical hours. Handson activities let students see the value in their learning while preparing to become healthcare professionals.







Agriculture

Students use state-of-the-art technology, such as CNC Plasma Tables and Routers, to learn about mechanical careers and skills. In the greenhouse, they grow, market, and sell a variety of plants. Learning how plant growth and the industry work together, they are able to demonstrate their learning in over 30 different competitions throughout the year.



Students gain business skills essentials for owning, managing, and/or working in a business. They are exposed to emerging technologies influencing businesses around the globe and learn leadership skills to make informed business decisions. Students learn and practice employability skills and research related careers.



Audio, Video Tech, and Film

Audio/Video Tech & Film (AVTF) students work with state of the art TV and Film production equipment. Students learn the correct operation of studio and field production equipment as well as the history of television, scriptwriting, news reporting, safety and post-production editing.
